## **RSU 18 Budget Vote is June 13**

Town residents will vote on the Regional School Unit 18 budget on Tuesday, June 13.

RSU 18 comprises Belgrade, China, Oakland, Rome and Sidney. The overall district budget for fiscal year 2023-24 is \$42,918,047.52. The town's share is \$5,326,292, and the town must appropriate \$4,888,758.


The 2023 School Budget Validation Referendum Election & Special Town Meeting Referendum vote will be from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. at the Community Center for All Seasons, 1 Center Drive (just south of the Village on Route 27), Voters may cast an absentee ballot at the Town Office before June 13. The last day absentee ballots are available is Thursday, June 8. They can be completed and dropped off at the town office either at the desk or in the drop box on the north porch, dropped off at the polls June 13, or mailed to the town office. If mailed, it must be done in enough time to get there by June 13.

A copy of the warrant is available on the elections page of the town website. A copy of the full budget, as approved May 18 at the district budget meeting, is available at rsu18.org/finance/budget.

# 2023 Community Read

This year's Belgrade Public Library Community Read is "This Wild Land: Two Decades of Adventure as a Park Ranger in the Shadow of Katahdin," by Andrew Vietze. The memoir recounts Vietze's 20 years as a ranger at Baxter State Park after making an unexpected career change from punk rock magazine editor. The book is available to borrow at the library, as well as on sale for a community read special discount at Oliver & Friends Bookshop, 87 Main St.

Vietze will be the guest of the Belgrade Public Library on Thursday, Aug. 24. The library is planning other events associated with the read, some in partnership with the Belgrade Historical Society. More inside.



## **Fireworks Rules**

Consumer fireworks, by Maine law:

• May only be used between 9 a.m. and 10 p.m. except July 4, Dec. 31 and the weekends before and after July 4 and Dec. 31, when the hours of use are extended until 12:30 a.m.

- They can only be used on your own property or the property of a person who has consented to their use.
- Those under 21 may not buy, use or possess consumer fireworks.

Violation of fireworks law is a civil offense that carries a fine and court costs.

Keep in mind that while you may be on vacation, neighbors have to get up in the morning for work, have young children who need to sleep through the night, have pets that may be traumatized by fireworks, or themselves may have challenges that make fireworks difficult to tolerate. Be a good neighbor and respect those around you.

# **Summer Transfer Station and Recycling Tips**

Pre-sorting makes things more efficient for everyone at the recycling windows — for you, your fellow recyclers jockeying for position and for the people who work there. This is particularly important in the summer, when the

recycling windows get crowded. Here are some tips for recycling and dropping off rubbish at the Transfer Station and Recycling Center:

- Pre-sort at home so that you are not sorting at the window or in your car as others wait and traffic backs up.
- Make sure recyclables are dry and free of food scraps and other contaminants, which can ruin the whole batch. If you hire someone to pick up your recyclables, let the hauler knows what's in your containers.
- See an attendent when dropping off large items (appliances, mattresses, etc.) Punch cards are available at the Town Office that allow free drop off for a certain amount of bulky items.
- The Too Good to Throw Away area is for items that are in good enough shape (working order, clean) that someone may still want them. There is limited space, so don't drop and run see an attendant dropping off.
- Use the textile recycling bin instead of dumping things that qualify in the hopper (see below).
- Ask for help. The staff is always happy to assist!

#### How to Recycle Textiles — And Help the Bottom Line

In 2022, the town produced 1,176.33 tons of solid waste, which was transferred at a cost of \$105,812, an average of \$89.95 a ton.

Textiles make up 8-10% of municipal waste. They're heavy, and even heavier when they're wet, which they'll get when they mix in the hopper with the other rubbish..

You can do your part to reduce what we pay for solid waste transfer

(and reduce what goes into landfills), by recycling textiles in the Apparel Impact bin at the Too Good to Throw Away area. Items don't have to be wearable — they can have stains, be torn, etc. They just have to be dry and have no mold or odor. They can include clothes, coats, sheets, towels, footwear, hats, purses, backpacks and more. Visit apperalimpact.com for more information.

## **Burn Permits**

Any open burning requires a burn permit, available at wardensreport.com. Permits are free, and regulated daily by the state, depending on wind and other weather conditions. They're issued after 9 a.m., once conditions are assessed.

Only brush and untreated clean wood can be burned. All fires must be fully extinguished before midnight. There have been many incidents in town of fires not fully extinguished causing wildfires. Unpermitted and illegal burns are investigated by the Maine Forest Service; and can lead to fines, or more if damage is extensive.

## Vehicle, Boat, Trailer Registration Tips

Those registering boats, trailers and vehicles are reminded to bring their registration, proof of insurance and current mileage if applicable. These items help the town clerk and staff expedite the process.

If buying a recreational (fishing, etc.) license, bring your driver's license with you. Re-registration is available on the town website town clerk's page.

Belgrade Public Library, Oliver and Friends Bookshop and the Parks and Recreation Dept. will host mystery writer Paul Doiron Thursday, June 29. Doiron's 14th Mike Bowditch thriller, "Dead Man's Wake," which comes out June 27, is set in Belgrade.

The event is free and open to the public at the Community Center for All Seasons, 1 Center Drive.

It will begin at 6 p.m. with a meet and greet, with catered finger foods, thanks to a donation from Lakehome Realty Group.

Doiron will read from "Dead Man's Wake," then discuss the book in a conversation with Maureen Milliken, chair of the library trustees and also a mystery writer. He'll answer questions from the audience, and end the event with a book signing. Books will be sold by Oliver & Friends. Copies of the new book, as well as some earlier ones, will be available at the event, and also can be pre-ordered for pickup at the store or at the event. Oliver & Friends is donating door prizes, including a grand prize swag bag of Maine-based gifts and Doiron's new book. There will also be door prize giveaways of the book.

Doiron, of Camden, is a registered Maine Guide. His books have won the Mystery Writers of America Edgar Award, the Maine Literary Award for Crime Fiction and the New England Society Book Award.

## **March Election Results**

In March 17 town election results, Dan Newman was re-elected to a three-year term on the Board of Selectpersons, and Peter Rushton was elected to complete Rick Damren's term. Newman's term will expire in 2026. He received 185 votes. There were 14 write-ins and 36 blank ballots. Rushton's term will expire in 2025. He received 187 votes; Nicholas Alexander received 42; there were no write-ins and 5 blanks.

Sarah Languet was elected to a three-year term on the RSU 18 school board, with 214 votes. There were no write-ins and 5 blanks.

## **Craft Fair**

The craft fair is the last Sunday of the month, except for October, when it is the second Sunday. The craft fair is held 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., rain or shine, at the Village Green, intersection of Main Street and West Road.


