Online Petition re: 142 Woodland

A copy of the online petition re: 142 Woodland was received in the Town Office November 29. The process is to confirm signatures, there were 23 valid signatures as presented; the requirement is 190.

Included in your packet is some information from Maine Municipal Association provided by our Town Clerk; a copy of the petition as submitted to the Town Office and a copy of the list of signers and the number of valid signatures. The online petition is no longer active as it was found to violate the website's (www.change.org) Community Guidelines and Terms of Service.

'Defective' Petitions

Maine Town & City - Legal Notes | Published: December, 2016

As we've noted here before, there are a variety of reasons why a town meeting petition may be rejected (see "Voter Petitions: What's a 'Reasonable' Refusal," Maine Townsman, Legal Notes, March 2010). For instance, if it lacks the requisite number of signatures or fails to request a meeting or include a proposed warrant article. Or it is unintelligible. Or it calls for action that is beyond the voters' authority. Or it asks for reconsideration of a recent vote. Or it demands an immediate meeting but the subject matter is not an emergency.

These are all legitimate grounds for refusing a town meeting petition. But there are other technicalities that would not justify rejecting a petition as "defective." These include:

Petition not addressed to selectmen. Though it is customary for a town meeting petition to be addressed to the selectmen, no law explicitly requires it. Provided the petition clearly asks for a town meeting vote, and presupposing that it bears the required number of signatures, meets all other legal requirements, and is otherwise lawful, it should be honored.

Petition not delivered to selectmen. As long as the petition is physically delivered to an official who is customarily an agent or intermediary for the selectmen, such as the clerk or the selectmen's secretary or assistant, this should be sufficient.

Petition fails to specify "article." If it is reasonably clear what the proposed question is, without guesswork or additional drafting, the failure to characterize it as an "article" should not disqualify the petition. (But if a petition proposes adoption of an ordinance but does not include the wording of the ordinance itself, it is legally insufficient – the selectmen are not required to draft anything.)

Petition includes multiple articles. The law does not limit town meeting petitions to just one article apiece, so this shouldn't disqualify the petition.

Petition includes both legal and illegal articles. This does not justify rejecting the entire petition. Only those articles that are illegal should be refused; the others should go to the voters, again assuming the petition is signed by a sufficient number of voters and complies with all other legal requirements.

Alert readers will recall that there are some significant new legal requirements for voter petitions, including: (1) circulators must be Maine residents and registered voters somewhere in Maine; (2) they must personally witness all signatures to the petition; and (3) they must verify this by circulator's affidavit (a signed, notarized statement). These are not mere "technicalities" that may be overlooked – failure to fully comply with them justifies refusing a petition. New Requirements for Local Petitions

Maine Town & City - Legal Notes | Published: April, 2016

We learned recently that amendments made by the Legislature last year to Title 21-A governing the circulation of state voter petitions have also effectively altered the requirements for circulating local voter petitions under Title 30-A and under municipal charters (see PL 2015, c. 99, § 1, amending 21-A M.R.S.A. § 903-A, which has long been incorporated by reference in 30-A M.R.S.A. § 2504 to govern the circulation of local petitions). These changes took effect on May 24, 2015.

The upshot is that now the circulator of a local voter petition must (1) be a Maine resident and registered voter somewhere in this state, (2) personally witness all signatures to the petition, and (3) verify this by a circulator's affidavit (a statement signed and sworn before a notary).

Also, the petition must include, along with the voter's signature, the voter's printed name, street address and municipality of residence.

If a petition fails to meet any of these requirements, it is invalid and cannot be certified by the municipal clerk or registrar of voters as legally sufficient. As a result, the petition will have no legally binding effect.

It is unclear whether the Legislature intended to alter the requirements for local petitions, but the linkage between Title 21-A and Title 30-A (see above) nevertheless has this effect.

It's noteworthy that nothing in the new law requires local officials to prepare petition blanks, and we generally discourage them from doing so unless required by applicable law (see "Should Office Staff Help Draft Petitions?," Maine Townsman, Legal Notes, April 2014).

It's also noteworthy that local nomination papers are not subject to these requirements unless imposed by municipal charter.

Prior Legal Notes on petitions, including "Voter Petitions: A Primer," Maine Townsman, February 2010, and "Voter Petitions: What's a Reasonable Refusal?," Maine Townsman, March 2010, should be read as being revised by this article.

Started by Concerned Citizens of Great Pond: Protect Our Lake

Protect Our Lake

Petition for the Town of Belgrade Select Board and Town Manager

Petition Summary:

The undersigned property owners care deeply about Great Pond. Upon information and belief, we are concerned that past actions by the owners of the property at 142 Woodland Camp Road likely were in violation of Town of Belgrade ordinances and are resulting in damage to the water quality of the pond. Great Pond is on the Maine Department of Environmental Protection's list of Impaired Lakes and is at risk for further water quality deterioration leading to algae blooms. Phosphorus and nitrogen are the key nutrients affecting water quality in Great Pond and, according to Maine DEP, "most of these nutrients are washed into our lakes during storms and snowmelt events where water washes over lawns, farm fields, roads, driveways, and construction sites." As we have seen with East Pond and North Pond, algae blooms often result in dramatically reduced tourism, restricted lake recreation opportunities, and lower property values.

It is our opinion that the owners of 142 Woodland Camp Road have illegally or improperly cut trees, brought in loam, established and fertilized a lawn, all within the 100 foot setback mandated by Town and State law. They have used a backhoe to remove stumps and move rocks by the lake permanently altering the shoreline. They have brought in flagstones in excess of the allowed impermeable surface as their property is bisected by a right-of-way. They have placed granite steps into the lake even though the surrounding area was neither unstable nor steep. They have closed off the Chester Thwing right-of-way, obscuring its borders, moved and installed plumbing in a bunkhouse without a visible permit, and erected a fence that appears to be in violation of the Maine spite fence ordinance.

Construction and landscaping have often taken place over weekends when the Code Enforcement Officer (CEO) was not on-duty.

While the owner's harvesting of bushels of freshwater shellfish from the lake is permitted by Maine Fish and Wildlife, the dumping of these mollusks on a neighbor's property was likely a violation. Certainly removal of these critical filter feeders from the lake was

unnecessary and damaging to the aquaculture and is indicative of callous disrespect of our shared natural resource.

The CEO, Town Manager, and Planning Board have all been made aware of these apparent violations and have not taken action to have the damage reversed. This damage must be repaired. The Town cannot continue to ignore what we believe to be violations. We consider this matter to be very serious and a threat to our quality of life as well as our financial interest.

Action Petitioned:

The undersigned are petitioning for the Select Board and Town Manager to enforce applicable state and town ordinances and oblige the owners of 142 Woodland Camp Road to remove the grass, loam, flagstones, and granite they placed within the 100 foot setback, plant substantial sized trees to replace the trees they cut, and restore the woodland understory to the condition it was in prior to their unpermitted action.

We believe that the owners of 142 Woodland Camp Rd. have demonstrated poor stewardship of the lake, and therefore further petition that any further permits at this or any other property they own or manage require site surveys in advance of permitting and any further permits-after-the-fact be in conformance with town and state ordinances.

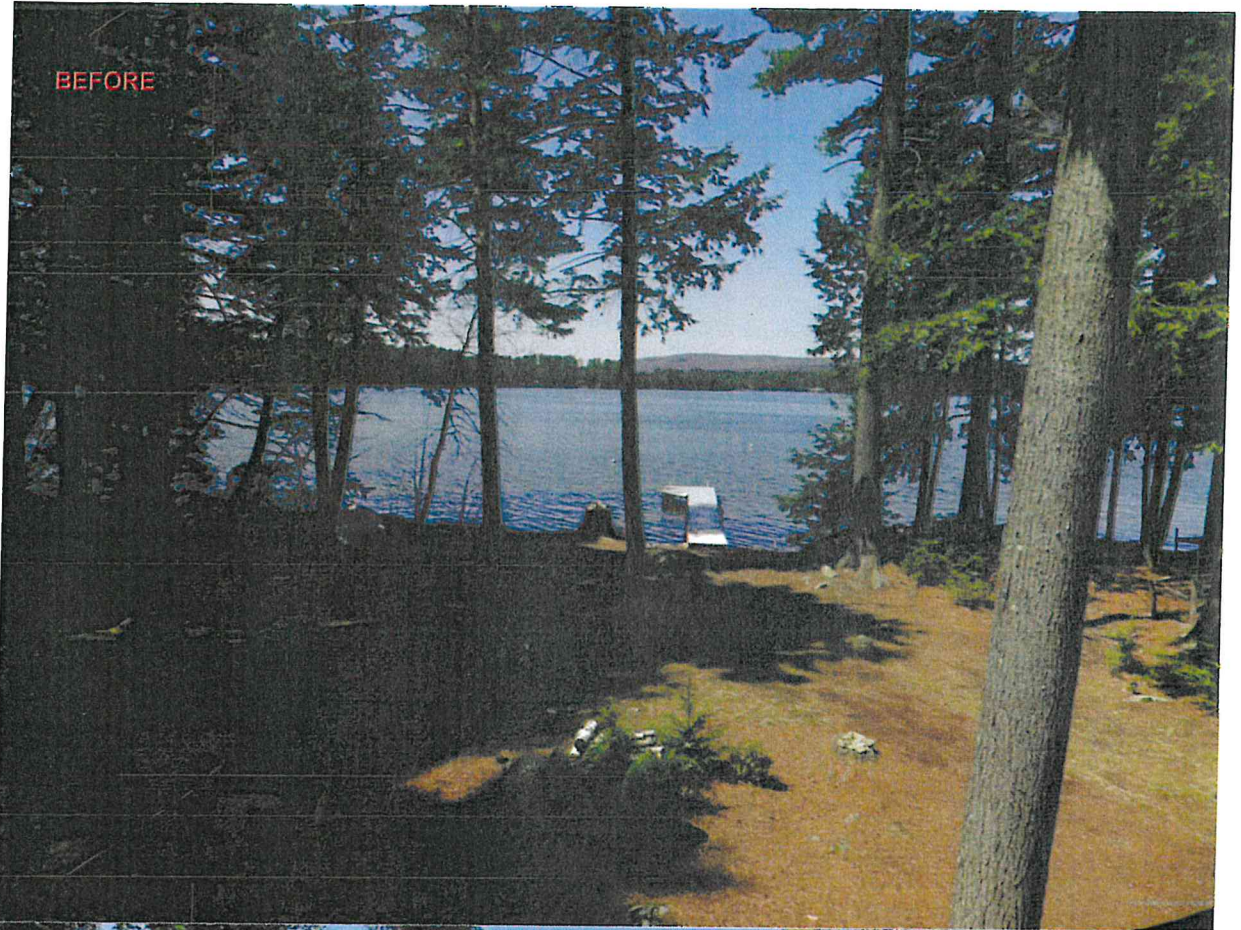

Special Procedures for Secret Ballot Towns

Towns which have adopted the secret ballot provisions of 30-A M.R.S.A. § 2528 have other rules to follow. These are discussed in much greater detail in MMA's *Town Meeting and Elections Manual*, but here are some important points:

- **For referendum questions**, any petition for a referendum vote or an order of the municipal officers calling for a vote on an issue as a referendum question must be filed with the clerk by the 45th day prior to the date of the election.

The municipal officers must hold a public hearing at least ten days before the town meeting, except for matters regarding bonding authority. At least seven days' notice of this public hearing must be posted in the same manner as a warrant for a town meeting.

Completed nomination papers (or certificates of political caucus nomination), must be filed with the clerk during business hours by the 45th day prior to Election Day. They must be accompanied by the written consent of the candidate agreeing to serve if elected.

- **For money articles (appropriations)**, the article must include a recommendation from the municipal officers. If there is a budget committee, its recommendation must also appear, and if the article affects the school budget, the school board's recommendation must appear as well.

A referendum vote is still a town meeting so the warrant should call for the election of a moderator even if no open meeting will follow.

The Petition Method of Putting an Article on the Warrant

This is one of the more controversial and misunderstood topics municipal officers will encounter. Title 30-A M.R.S.A. § 2522 says that on a written petition signed by a number of voters equal to at least 10% of votes cast in the town in the last gubernatorial election, but in no case less than 10, the municipal officers shall insert the petitioned article in the next warrant issued or within 60 days call a special town meeting for that article's consideration.

When the board receives a petition to place an article on the warrant, it should follow these steps:

- Verify that a sufficient number of registered voters have signed. (This is usually done by the town clerk working with the registrar of voters, as the petition is usually filed with the clerk initially.)
- Review the proposed article (which should appear in or attached to the petition) to determine whether it asks an unambiguous question and calls for action the town can legally take.
- If the petition is ambiguous or poorly worded, notify the circulators of the petition that there is a problem with the proposed article. The circulators can redraft the article and commence the petition process again or take the risk that the ambiguous article may not be valid if adopted. The board may put its own competing article in the warrant which is not ambiguous.
- If the petition calls for an illegal act, such as using town equipment to plow private roads, then you can refuse to put it on the warrant since it will not be effective even if adopted.

If there are sufficient signatures and a proper question, you must either include the article on the next warrant issued (so long as it has not already been posted and is scheduled to occur within seven days), or call a special town meeting within 60 days. Contrary to popular belief, the petitioners do not have the authority to choose the date of this special meeting. The municipal officers must call a meeting, but they have the final say on setting the date. Even if the “next warrant issued” is the annual meeting warrant which is months away, the municipal officers normally will not be obligated to call a meeting sooner on the petitioned article. However, if waiting would frustrate the purpose of the petitioned article (e.g., the action requested will necessarily have to be done prior to the annual town meeting), then refusal to call a special town meeting may constitute an “unreasonable refusal” to act by the board. An “unreasonable refusal” triggers the right to petition a notary public to call a town meeting on the article. (See the discussion below and “Voter Petitions: A Primer,” “Legal Notes,” *Maine Townsman*, February 2010) in Appendix 3.

Petitions to Reconsider; “Unreasonable Refusal”

A related question is whether the municipal officers must honor “reconsideration” petitions. This is when the town votes on a matter and within a few days or weeks a petition is presented to have the same issue brought back to special town meeting to be reconsidered.

A 1990 Superior Court decision, *Inhabitants of the Town of Vassalboro v. Denico*, CV-89-517 (Me. Super. Ct., Ken. Cty., Feb. 23, 1990) upheld the municipal officers' decision to refuse to honor such a petition. In addition, if the town has voted to take certain action and then enters into contracts or other legal obligations pursuant to that vote, it may not be unreasonable to refuse a later petition to revoke the original vote.

If the municipal officers "unreasonably refuse" to call a town meeting requested by a valid petition, a notary public may call the town meeting in accordance with 30-A M.R.S.A. § 2521(4). The final determination of what is reasonable or unreasonable refusal can only be made by a court, however.

For an extensive discussion of a variety of petition issues, see MMA's *Town Meeting and Elections Manual*.

Public Property

The municipal officers have a general obligation as executive officers to ensure that public property is not destroyed, wasted or misused. Public property may be "real" property (land and buildings) or "personal" property (vehicles, equipment, cash, and the like). Specific items of property are discussed below. In general, a municipality may purchase, sell or otherwise convey property and interests in property, such as leases and easements, through its legislative body. However, the municipal officers have an important role in overseeing the acquisition and sale of public property interests, and also in the legislative body's use of eminent domain to "take" private property for a public use upon payment of "just compensation." See MMA's "Eminent Domain" Information Packet. In many cases, a town board or commission also will have some involvement with the property (see Chapter 5 for related discussion).

Town Boundary Lines

Title 30-A M.R.S.A. §§ 2851-2852 provide that the majority of a board of municipal officers may notify the municipal officers of one or more adjoining municipalities of a dispute regarding boundary lines between the municipalities. In this case, the boundary must be perambulated (walked) to determine whether the boundary line is apparent within five meters. The municipal officers set this process in motion by sending at least 10 days' written notice of the time and place of perambulation. In the event of a boundary controversy, § 2852 outlines the procedure to settle matters; either party may file suit in the Maine Superior Court to have it resolve the controversy. The Court will appoint three commissioners to ascertain the boundary line. See Appendix 3 for a sample form used to certify that perambulation has been done.
